DRESSED FOR BATTLE: PUT ON THE FULL ARMOR OF GOD **EPHESIANS 6:10-18**

- Belt/Girdle of Truth-V. 14a The belt of a Roman solder did three things:
- Breastplate of Righteousness-V. 14b Two forms of righteousness:
- III. Shoes/Sandals of Peace—V. 15 Shoes/Sandals on a soldier meant two things:
- IV. Shield of Faith—V. 16
- V. Helmet of Salvation—V. 17a
- Sword of the Spirit—V. 17b (The only offensive weapon!)

Paul concludes this topic with a discussion of PRAYER—V. 18. Strangely enough, prayer is not really a piece of this armor, and this should tell us clearly that this passage is referring to a spiritual battle. It is a literal battle, yes, but it is not primarily physical or material. That is why we refer to this as "spiritual warfare." In this verse, Paul is telling us that our prayer life must be:

Constant V. 18a "pray at all times in the Spirit" Intense V. 18b "be on the alert with all perseverance and petition

"for all the saints"

Unselfish A look at 2 closing passages:

• Ephesians 1:18-23 (end of chapter)

V. 18c

Colossians 2:15

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WHAT DOES THE NAME **'JESUS' REALLY MEAN?** PART 1

Philippians 2:9-10 NKJV: "Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth ...,"

We hear a lot about "Jesus' Name" all the time. Have you ever wondered what the name of "Jesus" really means? Just what is in that name? Why are Christians told to call out to Jesus' Name for comfort and protection? Before we go any further, we all need to understand something. The name is mighty because of its holder. In this case, Jesus' power is because He is the Son of God and the risen Christ. He is not powerful just because His name is Jesus. Now let's get into the meaning of the name.

The name "Jesus" has its roots in the Hebrew name Yeshua/ Y'shua, which translates as "to deliver." Remember, Mary and Joseph didn't choose this name. It was a direct command from above, when an angel of the Lord came to Joseph in a dream:

Matthew 1:21 NKJV: "And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name [a]Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."

As mentioned, the power of the name lies with the holder of the name. The Bible does refer to other people named Jesus. (Reference directly below). This is also why it was common to see Christ being referred to as, "Jesus of Nazareth," to distinguish Him from others with that name.

Colossians 4:10–11 NKJV: "Aristarchus my fellow prisoner greets you, with Mark the cousin of Barnabas (about whom you received instructions: if he comes to you, welcome him), 11 and Jesus who is called Justus. These are my only fellow workers for the kingdom of God who are of the circumcision; they have proved to be a comfort

Next week we will look at how the name of Jesus means that Christians are saved.
