ADVENT 1

This Sunday is actually the second week of Advent on the Christian calendar. Advent spans the four weeks leading up to Christmas. There are several important aspects of Advent and, leading up to Christmas, we will cover the main ideas of what the Advent season is and how it is celebrated.

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in these "last days" (Acts 2:17, Hebrews 1:2) as God's people wait for the return of Christ to establish His eternal kingdom. The church of today is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament. The people waited and hoped in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's prior blessings in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus. They called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church today, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's birth in celebration, while at the same time looking forward anticipating to the coming of Christ's kingdom when He returns for His people.

The Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the church's cry during the Advent season:

O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
