

Names of God: Jehovah Rapha

As we continue our abbreviated studies of the Old Testament names of God, I trust that you are gaining a little more insight on the attributes of God. As we build our earthy relationships, we do so by learning more about those whom we are the fondest of. We take note of their nature and their very own, unique characteristics. We should be doing that ten-fold as we endeavor to build our relationship with God Almighty. This week we will look at God's name, Jehovah Rapha (raw-aw').

Use in the Bible: In the Old Testament Jehovah-Rapha (**The Lord that Heals**) is used in Exdus 15:26.

Variant spellings: Jehovah-Rophe; Jehovah Rophecha; Jehovah Raphah

We have already discovered that Jehovah is translated as "Lord." The chief meaning of Jehovah is derived from the Hebrew word Havah meaning "to be" or "to exist." It also suggests "to become" or specifically "to become known." This describes a God who is continually revealing Himself to us. That was a long, difficult way of describing the purpose of this series. That purpose is to demonstrate how God reveals Himself to use throughout the Old Testament.

Rapha (râpâ') means "to restore," "to heal," or "to make healthful" in Hebrew. When the two words are combined, Jehovah Rapha, it can be translated as "Jehovah Who Heals" or "The Lord Who Heals." Jehovah is The Great Physician who heals the physical and emotional needs of His people in His own time and His own manner.
