Names of God: Jehovah Tsidkenu

I believe it is of the utmost importance to know and understand the God of the Old Testament to better understand the God of the New Testament. God reveals Himself in many ways and He uses His many names in the Old Testament to reveal His nature, character, and attributes. We know that the Hebrew word Jehovah means Lord. This week we will look at God's name Jehovah Tsidkenu (tsid-kay'-noo).

Jehovah Tsidkenu is used two times in the Old Testament and is first used in Jeremiah 23:6. The name is also found in Jeremiah 33:16. Again, a word of caution or disclaimer ... I do no pretend to know or understand the Hebrew language. (I cannot even speak no good English!) I am passing along info to you based on my personal studies. Tsedek (tseh'-dek), from which Tsidkenu derived, means "to be stiff," "to be straight," or "righteous" in Hebrew. When the two words are combined, Jehovah Tsidkenu, it can be translated as "The Lord Who is our Righteousness."

All too often we neglect studies in the Old Testament to fast-forward to the New Testament. When we do so we miss out on the very foundation that the New Testament is built upon. Not only does God reveal Himself in the Old Testament, but His very Son, Jesus, is revealed there. The Crimson Thread of Christ Jesus begins in Genesis. Never should we neglect the Old Testament. When we do, we rob ourselves of the blessings of knowing God on a much higher plane.
