Names of God: Jehovah-Nissi

We continue our look at the names of God found in the Old Testament. We have seen that God reveals Himself throughout the Old Testament through the names in which He refers Himself. Without proper knowledge of the God of the Old Testament, we find that it is really impossible to know the depth of our majestic God. This week we will look at the name, Jehovah-Nissi.

Use in the Bible: In the Old Testament Jehovah-Nissi occurs only once in Exodus 17:15.

Jehovah is translated as "The Existing One" or "Lord." Nes (nês), from which Nissi is derived, means "banner" in Hebrew. In Exodus 17:15, Moses, recognizing that the Lord was Israel's banner under which they defeated the Amalekites, builds an altar named Jehovah-Nissi (**the Lord our Banner**). Nes is sometimes translated as a pole with an insignia attached. In battle opposing nations would fly their own flag (banner) on a pole at each of their respective front lines. This was to give their soldiers a feeling of hope and a focal point as well as a place to rally after being separated from the main group of warriors. This is what God is to us: a banner of encouragement to give us hope, a focal point and a point to rally to when we get separated from Him.

Have you ever wondered why some churches hang banners from the ceiling or walls? It is because of Jehovah-Nissi! Have you ever wondered why some churches carry banners down the isles at the opening and closing of a worship service? It is because of Jehovah-Nissi! Have you ever wondered why some churches dance and wave banners during the worship service? It is because of Jehovah-Nissi! Jehovah-Nissi, **the Lord Our Banner!**
